Psalm 19

Reading: Psalm 19:1-14

The “*heavens declare the glory of God*” – what does that mean for our culture and the people of the world?

Romans 1:20 - *For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even His eternal power and Godhead, so that they are without excuse...*

How does missionary stories like Don Richardson’s *Peace Child* driving the point home that we have no excuse for not seeing His glory?

How does missions produce worshippers and why is that the ultimate goal of God?

Why are the laws or instructions of the Lord so sure, wise, and perfect? Why should we run toward these things – not run away from them?

As believers – we should not be trying to see what we can get by with – but desiring God’s best for our lives. How do we acknowledge and receive the grace of God to help us?

1 Corinthians 10:23 – “*All things are lawful for me, but not all things are helpful; all things are lawful for me, but not all things edify.*”
