Reading: Psalm 29:1-11

When Psalm 29 is taking about the "mighty ones" – who exactly are they and why should they bow to their knees?

What do you think of when you see the words – "many waters"? Do you think peaceful or turbulent seas?

His VOICE is powerful. If it "strips the forest bare", how should we respond to His voice?

Revelation 4:10 - "the twenty-four elders fall down before Him who sits on the throne and worship Him who lives forever and ever and cast their crowns before the throne."

Why should we raise our gaze regularly to the King of Kings?

Mark 4:38-39 – "But He (Jesus) was in the stern, asleep on a pillow. And they awoke Him and said to Him, "Teacher, do You not care that we are perishing? Then He arose and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, "Peace, be still!"

In the depths of the waters as we are surrounded by death, pain, heartache, and agony – does the Lord still rule?

Promise to cling to this week: "The Lord sat enthroned at the Flood, And the Lord sits as King forever." (verse 10)
