Praise and Prayers for Every Day Psalm 35

Reading: Psalm 35:1-28

What is the promise that David was clinging to, and we can cling to this week out of verse 27?

What can we rejoice in even in the middle of circumstances that are against us?

David makes it clear in verses 12-16 why he thinks this situation is unjust. What had he done in a righteous way in response to his enemies?

How should the "quiet ones in the land" respond to injustice? How should we respond in these turbulent times?

Matthew 10:27-31 – "Whatever I tell you in the dark, speak in the light; and what you hear in the ear, preach on the housetops. And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. But rather fear Him who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell. Are not two sparrows sold for a copper coin? And not one of them falls to the ground apart from your Father's will. But the very hairs of your head are all numbered. Do not fear therefore; you are of more value than many sparrows."

Why should we "shout for joy" even when we don't feel like it? How does that help us take ahold of the promises of God in our lives?

Promise to cling to this week: "Let the Lord be magnified, Who has pleasure in the prosperity of His servant." (verse 27b)
