## Praise and Prayers for Every Day

## Psalm 41

Reading: Psalm 41:1-13

When we are born again – we enter into a relationship with the Body of Christ – how should we treat the "poor" especially in the household of faith?

What is our promise if we "consider the poor" and how should that manifest in the future?

**Galatians 6:9-10 -** "And let us not grow weary while doing good, for in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart. Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all, especially to those who are of the household of faith."

How should we respond when our friends are experiencing hardship and pain? Should we judge them like Job's friends?

What is the "heel" that was against the Psalmist and does betrayal come against us many times as believers?

How do we overcome those wounds in our souls? What does it mean to "set me before Your face forever"?

**Hebrews 12:1b-2a-** "and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, <u>looking unto Jesus</u>, the author and finisher of our faith..."

**Promise to cling to this week:** "As for me, You uphold me in my integrity, And set me before Your face forever." (verse 12)
